Father Armentrout's message . . . Thank you for the warm welcome to Cathedral and St. Mary Church!

Tomorrow we celebrate the liturgical feast of Sts. Joachim and Anne, the parents of our Blessed Mother Mary. Our Christian Tradition has long venerated the parents of the Blessed Mother. They were entrusted with the noble task of raising Mary to be the Mother of God and equip her for her role in salvation history. Although Scripture remains silent on the actual names of the grandparents of our Lord, we have long venerated them under the names previously mentioned. The names Joachim and Anne come from a few other non-Scriptural sources from the first few centuries after our Lord's life, so the names seem to be well grounded in tradition. A person might be inclined to ask why their names are not mentioned in Scripture if they seemed to have the important role of safeguarding the blessed Mother until her betrothal to Joseph! First of all, the Gospel of John reminds us at the conclusion that only a few things were written regarding the life of our Lord- those most profitable for our salvation- and that all of the pages in the world could not contain all that has been done by Him! The same could be said about God preparing his people for his coming in the Old Testament. Certain things remain hidden that will not be absolutely known until we receive our heavenly reward! Think of the thirty years that our Lord spent in Nazareth. The majority of his life is still hidden from us! In other words, some bits of knowledge are not essential to us for our salvation. Yet we do know some things about the grandparents of our Lord. Joachim and Anne would have given our Blessed Mother a righteous upbringing. She must have spent much time reflecting on Scripture with her parents. One need only to spend a moment looking at the famous 'song of Mary' recorded in St. Luke to recognize that her response to God "My Soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my savior..." is Mary's own adaptation of scriptural texts in the Old Testament where she takes something familiar and turns it into her own prayer! St. Anne and Joachim would have given her the upbringing necessary to prepare her for her mission in life. How noble this is! I hope that all the grandparents in this parish know how important of a role they can have in influencing the piety of their grandchildren! My own grandmother, for example, taught me how to pray the rosary at a young age.

A priest friend of mine has a great devotion to St. Anne and in his rectory, there is a nice oil painting of our Lord playing in front of the Blessed Mother and St. Anne. My favorite thing about this painting is how approachable it makes our Lord. He, like you and me, was born into a human family. He was given a mother and father. He was given grandparents too. His grandparents would have taught him and poured out affection upon him like yours and mine. This week it might be good to ask St. Anne and Joachim to pour out abundant graces on our grandparents, parents, and children. That through their heavenly intercession all grandparents might be great loving role models who strive, like Joachim and Anne, to teach children the Love of God and the way of virtue. And furthermore, that through their heavenly cooperation, the Catholic Schools and Homes in St. Joseph, might be places of virtue, equipping our next generation to serve our Lord in true Christian charity.




